

ANNUAL REPORT 2025-26

Academic Session

The academic session was conducted in a well-structured and student-centric manner, focusing on holistic development and academic excellence. The school maintained a disciplined learning environment, ensuring effective curriculum delivery and continuous academic monitoring.

Academic Excellence

The school achieved remarkable success in the CBSE Board Examination 2024-25, recording a 100% pass result. All students passed with flying colours securing distinctions, reflecting the collective efforts of students, teachers, and parents.

Examination Pattern

The school follows the CBSE *two-term end examination scheme *, comprising Term I and Term II assessments. In addition to the term-end examinations, students are evaluated through two Unit Tests and Periodic Tests conducted between the terms. This continuous assessment pattern ensures regular evaluation, academic reinforcement, and steady progress of learners.

Club activities

June 5, World Environment Day

World environment day was observed by the Eco Club through a thematic dance, student speeches on nature conservation, and a rally displaying posters highlighting the importance of environmental protection.

Reading Day (June 19):

Reading Day was observed by the Malayalam Club in collaboration with the Library Department through a library visit to St. Joseph's Library, St. Joseph's College, Devagiri, and various competitions including reading, word making, speech, and book review.

International Yoga Day (June 21):

International Yoga Day was observed by the Health and Wellness Club at Chaliyam Beach through guided yoga practice sessions, including basic asanas, breathing exercises, and relaxation techniques, promoting physical and mental well-being.

July 5 – Basheer Day

Basheer Day was observed by the Malayalam Club through an educational visit to the residence of Vaikom Muhammad Basheer, highlighting his life and literary contributions. Students presented literary programmes, and a mangosteen sapling was planted on the school campus in remembrance of the writer.

August 6 – Hiroshima Day:

Hiroshima Day was observed by the Eco Club through a flash mob performed by Grade 6 students at public places near the school, spreading the message of peace and humanity.

August 8 – Quit India Movement Day:

Quit India Movement Day was observed by the Eco Club through a quiz competition for students of Grades 9 and 10 to promote historical awareness and patriotism.

August 15 – Independence Day:

Independence Day was celebrated in a grand manner with house-wise march past, flag hoisting, and various cultural programmes. The National Flag was hoisted by our Chairman, Haji A. P. Abdul Kareem. The presence of Dr. Mohammed Haneefa (Secretary of Trust) and Dr. T. A Abdul Azeez (Treasurer of Trust) Trust members, PTA President Mrs. Shamnaz, and Vice President Mr. Hassan added significance to the event. In connection with the celebration, various library-based competitions such as flag drawing, tag making, greeting card making, and quiz competitions were conducted prior to the day.

August 28 – Creation of a Micro Forest:

December 15 – National Mathematics Day:

National Mathematics Day was celebrated by the Mathematics Club with activities such as maths relay, Sudoku, quizzes, and puzzle competitions for students of Grades 3 to 9.

Sports Activities

Malabar Sahodaya – Inter-School Chess Tournament:

The Malabar Sahodaya Inter-School Chess Tournament was held on July 12, 2025, at MSS Public School, Mavilikkadavu, where Eisa Rifayi (Grade 8) secured

4th position in the Under-14 Boys category and Shameel Hashim (Grade 8) secured 7th position in the Under-17 Boys category.

The Annual Sports Meet Sprintx was held from November 19 to 21, 2025. Mr. Jiyad Hassan, a Santhosh Trophy player, inaugurated SprintX. It featured various track and field events across age categories, followed by a friendly football match and prize distribution. .

Kerala Central Schools Sports Meet:

Students participated in the Kerala Central Schools Sports Meet (District Level) held on November 27, 2025, at Olympian Rahman Stadium, Kozhikode, securing commendable positions in athletics events.

Co-Curricular Activities

School Parliamentary Election:

The School Parliamentary Election was conducted on June 26, 2025, with active student participation, leading to the election of school leaders for the academic year.

Zeitgeist – The School Arts Fest:

The School Arts Fest Zeitgeist was conducted in two phases with off-stage events during July–August and on-stage events on August 19 and 20, 2025. The fest was inaugurated by Mrs. Monisha, a playback singer. The competitions were organized in accordance with Malabar Sahodaya guidelines. Award prizes and certificates were distributed to winners.

Onapolivu – Onam Celebration:

Onam was celebrated as Onapolivu on August 27, 2025, with floral decorations, house-wise competitions, traditional games, and cultural activities.

Malabar Sahodaya Arts Fest:

Students participated in all phases of the Malabar Sahodaya Arts Fest. Fathima Minha K of grade 9 secured third place in Malayalam versification and many of them secured A grades in various items, with the school achieving commendable overall performance.

Children's Day:

Children's Day was celebrated on November 14, 2025, with cultural programmes by teachers and a cake-cutting ceremony.

Motivation Class for Grade 10:

A motivational session for Grade 10 students and parents was conducted with Dr. Justin Jones, Principal of St. Francis Higher Secondary School, Kundayithode focusing on effective study techniques and goal setting.

World Disability Day:

World Disability Day was observed on December 3, 2025, in collaboration with Calicut Higher Secondary School for the Handicapped, Kolathara, highlighting inclusivity through speeches and cultural performances.

A two-day study tour for Grades 9 and 10 was conducted to Coorg and Chikmagalur on December 11, 2025, providing enriching educational exposure. A one-day study tour for Grades 1 to 5 was organized to Sky Wave theme park, offering an educational and recreational experience.

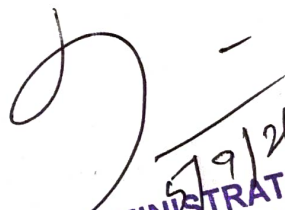
ECCE Section – Annual Activities (2025–26)
